Our Vision:




* Life Skills Training includes: Crochet, Jewelry-Making, Employment-related courses, Cooking Classes, etc.


* Youth Engagement includes: Summer Reading Program, Arts & Crafts Program, Cooking Classes, Movie Night, Dr. Seuss Event, etc.

Zip Codes for Families Served












MOBILE SENIOR SUCCESS CENTER MODEL:






